When Sid's mother, Sybil Stockdale, found the government's handling of the POW issue incompetent she began organizing other POW wives and demanding change. She also began working with Naval Intelligence, sending and receiving secretly coded letters with Sid's Dad in prison. Sid Stockdale was thrown headlong into this emotional and political cauldron; a young boy forced to deal with adult traumas and relentless struggle. As his father's treatment and fate as a prisoner became more desperate and his mother's arduous struggle began to take its toll on her health, Sid did his best to cope, provide support, care for his two younger brothers, and survive adolescence. This is the story of how Sid emerged from this nightmare a healthy young man and how his family was reunited and rebuilt their life together.


